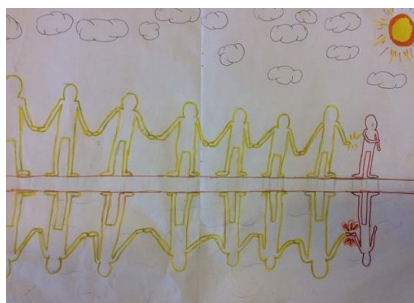

2019 VPA China Student Exchange for our Year Five and Year Six Students

ENPS has been successful in applying for the 2019 VPA China Student Exchange Program.

We received a number of expressions of interest from Year Five and Six students, and staff, wishing to participate, and it was very difficult for us to select only five students and one teacher.

Can I take the opportunity to congratulate Michelle Galea (Year Five) who will be travelling to China from Thursday 17th October to Thursday 31st October with Amelia, Ava, Nadra (Year Five), Caitlin and Joanna (Year Six).

This educational experience will offer Michelle and these five students with an opportunity to be part of China's remarkable education system as well as experience the fascinating culture of the world's most populous country. During a fourteen-day exchange program, students will attend Jinling Primary School in Nanjing, and participate in classroom and cultural activities, whilst visiting amazing sight-seeing locations in Shanghai.

We wish Michelle and our five students the very best with their preparations for their student exchange. Please note that a suitably qualified teacher will be arranged to replace Michelle G in her two-week absence from our school.

Upcoming Works at ENPS

Yesterday I sent a letter to all ENPS parents and carers. My letter outlined a range of works that will be undertaken at ENPS over the coming weekend and holiday period. As outlined in my letter, it is important that no one is onsite on the dates the weekend of March 30th to March 31st as well as from April 6th to 21st. Please refer to my letter for further details. If anyone has any questions about the works, they can direct them to the VSBA, as these works are being lead and managed by them.

School Oval Upgrade

As you are aware, the Victorian State Government granted ENPS \$411,000 to upgrade our school's oval. EDU Projects Pty Ltd is managing our project. Two plans were proposed including a fully natural grass option and a synsthetic turf option.

On Monday 18th February School Council held an open community forum to share these two proposals, and I wish to extend my thanks to the many parents, carers and staff who attended.

It is clear that a synsthetic turf option is preferred. This option is estimated at \$630,000. Stadium seating is also being considered as part of our oval upgrade, and this will bring the cost of our project to \$700,000 (approx.).

We are continuing to explore all of our options and gathering some more information as to how we can fund this project.

Pedestrian Safety

Can I take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers that is imperative that ALL our students learn safe, responsible and appropriate road and pedestrian habits.

It is with this in mind that we ask you to use the designated school crossings on Keilor Road and McCulloch Street when crossing the road with your child/ren.

Unfortunately, there have been some recent instances whereby children have crossed Keilor Road without using the designated school crossing. This has mostly happened after school at the top end of Gillies Street. In some instances, an adult was escorting the child/ren across the road, and we would appreciate your appropriate role modelling and cooperation with this matter.

COMPASS KIOSK: STUDENT PICK UP AND DROP OFF DURING SCHOOL HOURS

Parents may need to drop students off late, or pick them up early or during the course of the school day for appointments etc.

You may do this via the Compass Kiosk in the front office.

PICK UP

When you arrive at the school office, please inform staff that you intend to pick up your child and your child's name and class. **Parents are not to enter the school during the school day.** Office staff will contact the class teacher and your child will be instructed to meet parents and carers at the school office.

Parents will need to sign the child out by selecting 'Parent Pick Up' from the Compass Kiosk.

Enter your child's name, the reason they are leaving school and select which parent or carer is collecting the student.

DROP OFF

When students are returned to school, select 'Parent Drop Off' from the Compass Kiosk.

Enter your child's name, the reason they were absent and select which parent or carer is dropping the student back to school. Your child can go to join their class.

Financial assistance will be allocated to your family's account and paid towards ENPS camps, sports and excursions held 2019.

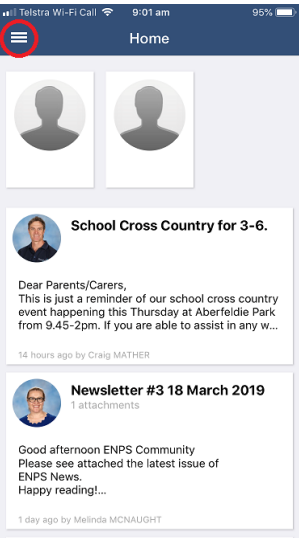

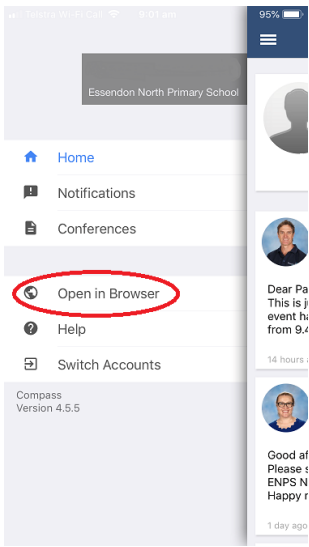
How do I pay for my child's events?

Please follow the steps below on how to make a payment for school events using your device.

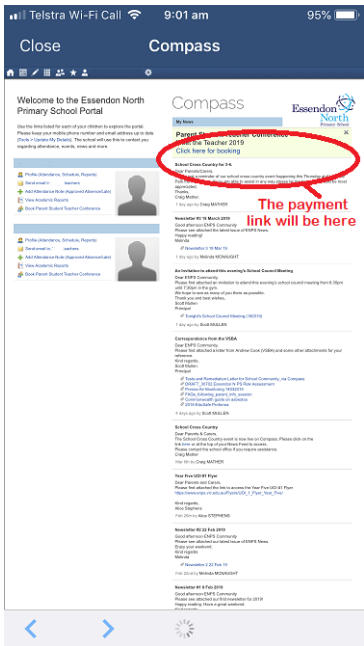
If you are using your PC/laptop, please start at Step 3.



STEP 1: Open your mobile browser. Select the three bars on the top left hand side of the screen.



STEP 2: Select 'open in browser'. This will take you to the web version of Compass.



STEP 3: The payment link will be on the right side highlighted in green.

Click on the link and go to the payments page. Any outstanding payments will have a red button noting "Process Now".

On the payments page please check:

Your contact details on the day of the event;

Any medical information you need to provide for your child.

The consent for the event will consist of you typing your name to confirm at the bottom.

The payment information follows.

When you have finished, press **Submit**.

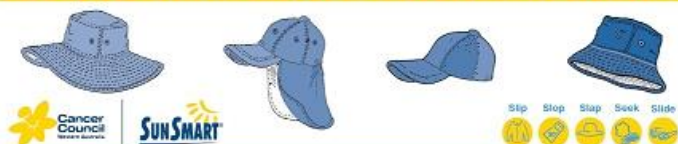

Safety around schools

Providing safe school zones for all children



Keep children safe in a school zone by:

- walking or cycling to school to decrease traffic congestion
- adhering to the 40km per hour zone when travelling in an operated school zone
- checking the restrictions set by the regulations and parking signs in the area and abiding by them
- not stopping or parking illegally – these actions will be noticed and infringements will be issued by Council.

You should:

- always let your child out on the kerb side of the road
- never call your child from across the road – teach them to wait until you walk over to get them or to use the school crossing
- talk to your child about what they should do if you are not there on time.

A children's crossing is a legal crossing when two flags are in place.

Teach your child to:

- always stand one step back from the kerb
- wait for the Crossing Supervisor to go out onto the crossing and blow their whistle (two short blasts), then cross the road
- not ride bikes, bounce a ball, fight, muck around or run across the crossing
- always stay within the lines of crossing and walk in front of the supervisor (never behind them)
- always be alert and listen to what the Crossing Supervisor says.




Parking near a school

- Do not park on or near a school crossing.
- Do not double park and let your child out on the road.
- You cannot stay in the drop off/pick up zone for longer than two minutes or you will be issued with an infringement. Make sure your child is waiting in the zone before you arrive.

Infringements

Council regularly patrols schools as part of our School Crossing Program. Council will issue infringements to anyone who does not obey signs or regulations. Infringements can be affixed to the vehicle or posted to the registered owner of the vehicle.

Offence and penalty when committed in an operating school zone

Offence	Offence description	Fine
	Stopped in a 'no stopping' area	Drivers cannot stop, even briefly. \$161
	Stopped in a bus zone	Only public buses can stop here. \$97
	Parked for period longer than indicated	This is when you have overstayed the time limit indicated on the sign. \$81
	Stopped in a parking area for people with disabilities	You need a special disabled parking permit to park here. The permit number and expiry date must be visible from the outside. \$161
	Stopping on or near a children's crossing	A driver must not stop on a children's crossing, or on the road within 20 metres before, or 10 metres after the crossing. \$161
	Stopped on a footpath	You cannot leave your car standing on a footpath, it obstructs the path of pedestrians and is also very dangerous. \$97
	Stopped on or across a driveway or other way of access	No part of your vehicle can be parked or stopped across a driveway or other way of access. \$97
	Parked/stopped on a nature strip	A driver must not stop on a nature strip as it can obstruct the view of oncoming traffic and cause damage to infrastructure. \$97

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FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
