With the support of our amazing staff, our Year Three and Five students have taken on NAPLAN this week and while we all know that any child is much more than a test, each and every one of them showed they were knowledgeable, persistent, open minded and resilient. Regardless of any outcome, we are so proud of them all.

Mother's Day Celebrations

Despite the inclement weather, thank you to everyone who came along and joined in on our Mother's Day activities last Friday afternoon. It was so lovely to see students spend time in a range of different classrooms, doing so many engaging activities with their mums, grandmothers and mother figures. Our sausage sizzle raised \$750, so we are well on our way to our \$3000 target for this term!



Play and Outdoor Learning Space Design Competition

Make sure you get a chance to see the wonderful design entries on display around the office. Students from Foundation to Year Six have submitted their ideas and play space designs this week. Congratulations to our competition winners: Naufal (1CT) & Nadra (5ET), Atticus (2CW), Oliver (4MA) and Juana (4JS).

These four students will be our student representatives to work with our learning environments design team in planning the short and long term designs for our new play space around the Year One and Two learning neighbourhoods.

Works update

Over the past weeks, our oval works have gone through the tender process and we hope to soon be able to share the designs for what our oval will look like. Works are expected to start on the surfacing before the end of May, with completion anticipated by the end of Term Three. That does mean our restricted play space arrangements will continue well into Term Three, however, we are in the process of developing a range of alternatives for recess and lunch times, and our Play Leaders have now begun and are already having a very positive impact.

The asphalt works on the demolition site have begun with levelling and ground preparation. The final resurfacing, which was scheduled for this Saturday, has been rescheduled to Saturday 25th May 2019.

The new portable is being completed with the installation of window guards for the rear windows, to avoid any potential ball damage. It is anticipated that this is completed by next week.

Our colleagues in the Department of Education and Training have advised us that information regarding the follow up to last term's asbestos incident will be made available early next week. We will circulate this via Compass as soon as it becomes available.

Professional Learning

You may have noticed, our teachers being released over the past weeks for professional practice days. All teaching staff are assigned four professional practice days throughout the year for professional learning. Our teachers have been using their day this term for developing their professional practice in the use of data, observing each other and developing their professional knowledge on our school priority area of teaching writers. Over the coming week, teams will have scheduled planning days. This provides an opportunity for each year level and specialist team to effectively collaborate, learn together and plan their upcoming unit of inquiry.

A reminder that our enrolments are open for 2020 Foundation students. Enrolments close on Friday 31st May. The office have enrolment packs ready for collection and we are very happy to answer any questions you may have.

Annual General Meeting (AGM)

Fighting Lyons:

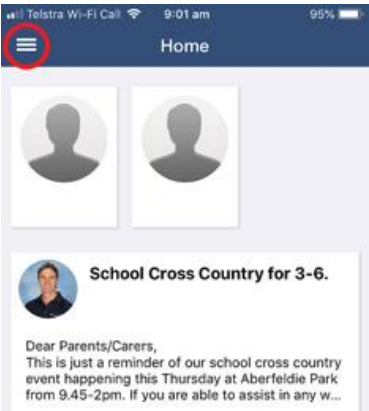

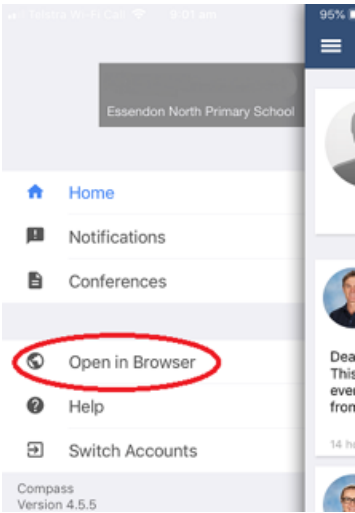

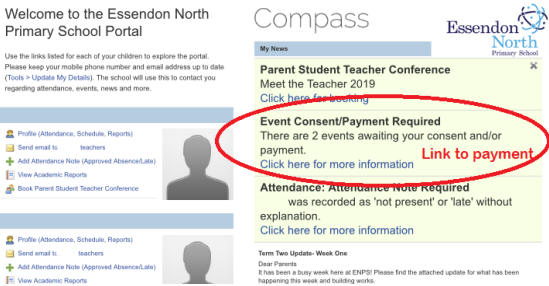

Safety Around Schools

Moonee Valley City Council is committed to providing safe school zones for all children.

We ask you to also commit to keeping your children safe when in a school zone by:

- Walking or cycling to school to increase the safety around schools and decrease the congestion
- Adhering to the 40km zone when travelling in an operated school zone
- Checking the restrictions set by the regulations and parking signs in the area and abiding by them to improve children's safety around schools
- Being aware that each time you stop or park illegally you can endanger a child's life
- Illegal behaviour will not go unnoticed; parking infringements will be issued by Council
- Do not ride bikes across the crossing, bounce a ball, fight, muck around or run – walk quickly and safely
- Always stay within the lines of crossing and walk in front of the supervisor (never behind them)
- Always be alert and listen to what your Children's Crossing Supervisor says

School crossings

- A children's crossing is a legal crossing when two flags are in place
- You must always stand one step back from the kerb
- Wait for the Children's Crossing Supervisor to go out onto the crossing – WAIT! When they have blown their whistle (two short blasts), it is safe to cross

Parking near a school

- Always let your child out on the kerb side of the road
- Do not park on or near a school crossing
- Do not double park and let your child out on the road
- Never call your child from across the road, teach them to wait until you come to them or to use the school crossing
- Talk to them about what they should do if you are not there on time
- Many schools have adopted a 'drop off and pick up' zone – a facility that is convenient for drivers while enhancing safety of the child
- When using a 'drop off and pick up' zone in the school's designated area, please follow the school's road safety procedures and time limits

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
